



COVID-19 Daily Self-Certification: Student Health Screening

Instructions:

- In accordance with the Illinois Department of Public Health and Illinois State Board of Education requirements, students must be screened **each day** for COVID-19 symptoms and other criteria prior to entering a school building.
- Parents must screen their child each day prior to sending their child to school.
- If your child does not meet all the following criteria, you must keep your child at home and notify the school of your child's absence. **By sending your child to school, you are certifying you have screened your child, and he/she meets all the following criteria to attend school.**

Criteria to Attend School-Checked Daily at Home
My child does not have a temperature over 100.0 F.
My child is not taking fever-reducing medicines, such as those that contain aspirin, ibuprofen or acetaminophen, in order to reduce his/her fever.
My child has not had close contact or cared for someone with COVID-19 within the past 14 days.
My child has not traveled out of the United States within the past 14 days, or any student returning from a location with the sustained widespread transmission (Travel Warning of Level 3) should not attend school for 14 days after the return date.
My child has not been directed to self-quarantine by a healthcare provider, by the County, or State Department of Public Health.
My child does not have any of the following symptoms:
-chills -cough, not allergy related -shortness of breath -extreme fatigue - persistent headache -congestion or runny nose, non allergy related
-muscle or body aches -new loss of taste or smell -sore throat, non allergy related -nausea or vomiting
-diarrhea, except for ongoing chronic diseases

I understand that I am required to honestly and accurately complete this checklist for my child each day before sending my child to school. The bottom of this form will be signed at the beginning of each semester.
